This week marks the start of Black History Month. This month, children will gain more of an understanding of what 'diversity' is and why Black History Month is celebrated. In KS1, classes are reading 'Jazz Man' and will put together whole class performances. Leading into KS2, where they will focus on the achievements of past heroes who advocated civil rights movements, as well as celebrating inspiring black role models such as athletes, poets and musicians too.

On Tuesday 20th, Wednesday 21st and Thursday 22nd October we will be holding online Parents Evening meetings. The sign up sheets for each class' Parents Evening will go live on the Whole School Google Classroom at 9pm tonight (Thursday) and parents from Year 1 - 6 should sign up for their 10 minute slot. You will only be able to access these sign up sheets by using your child's school Google login. Please sign up by Tuesday 13th. On Wednesday 14th, your child will receive an email to their school account, inviting you to a Parents Evening Google Meet. This email contains the link for you to access your Parents Evening appointment at your allotted time.

We have made two videos explaining how to sign up and how to access the Google Meet for Parents Evening. Please ensure that you watch these videos prior to 9pm so that you are clear on how to sign up and please be aware that you will need to login using your child's school google account to access the documents.

Whilst we know that you would like to talk to teachers for longer than the normal 10 minute slot, unfortunately this will not be possible. We are stretching the Parents Evenings out over three evenings in order to allow for any technical issues that people may have. Your child is welcome to join you for the session.

Miss Sanett and/or Mrs Ingall will also be available to call to answer any general questions or to discuss any other matters that are not the direct concern of the class teacher.

Ms Kanji, our Inclusion Leader/Special Needs Co-ordinator, will also be available to call if you have any questions for her.

This week has been another busy week across the school with lots going on...

EYFS: We kicked off Black History Month by looking at some inspirational figures: Rosa Parks, Mae Jemison, Ruby Bridges, Martin Luther King Jr and Katherine Johnson. Our own dreams to make the world better, inspired by MLK's speech, included playing with everyone, not cutting down trees, sharing food, and cake for everybody! We are getting really good at identifying rhymes, beats within words and alliteration in Phonics, and in Maths we have learned a lot about number 2: doubles, pairs, partners, odd and even, shapes with 2 sides, one and another one... and more besides!

KS1: The rat is finally here! This week, Key Stage 1 have begun their Literacy unit on Julia Donaldson's story of the villainous and greedy Highway Rat. The children have been listening carefully to the story, understanding the sequence of events and identifying rhyme in the text. In Computing, the children have been practising logging on in the ICT suite. In Guided Reading, the children have been looking at the text 'The Jazz Man', as part of Black History Month.

LKS2: In English, we've loved working with the story 'Stone Age Boy' and the children have now written their own versions. They've worked so hard planning their ideas and working hard with their buddies to produce a wonderful narrative. In Maths, we are all counting in 2's, 3's, 4's, 5's, 10's, 50's as well as other tables so that we become expert counters! We are also beginning to work hard on our understanding of addition as well as subtraction. In History, we're continuing to learn about life in the Stone Age and finding out the answers to our own questions. We've also learnt about Beaker Bell pots and have designed and made our own from clay which the children really enjoyed. In our computing lessons, we are creating Google slideshows which include internet research about various predators. In Science, the children have enjoyed investigating how various animals move and how their skeleton helps them to do so.

#### UKSZ:

This week, 5/6 have been working hard Looking at poetry, we have become 'the Bard' Ben Zephaniah and Valerie Bloom Two black poets to inspire the kids in the room!
