A few weeks ago I explained some of the concepts that we are learning about throughout the school. I also talked about how metacognition, explaining how we learn, can be seen across the year groups and the Foulds children have become very good at explaining why and how they have got an answer to a question. Last week a child asked why we need to learn about metacognition if they are doing it every day anyway. I took the opportunity to teach the children a little more about what metacognition is and the purpose of it.

In my assembly on Monday, I explained to the children that if growth mindset is believing we can do anything we just might not be able to do it YET and about jumping into the learning pit, metacognition is what we use when we are in the learning pit. Metacognition is about evaluating the problem, thinking about what you know from past learning, linking and then extending ideas to use in the current situation. We need to know what metacognition is to help us become aware of how our past learning can help us and so that we recognise that we can make links and have more independence in our learning! We also thought about how amazing our brains are, how fast they work and how signals in your neurons can travel at the same speed as Formula 1 cars!

This week around the school:

EYFS: We finally finished our amazing book... and the children are both thrilled to know the ending at last, and devastated it is over! The teachers have been amazed by the incredible language and discussion from the children. In Maths, we have been continuing with teen numbers and the children have shown deep understanding of how these are made up, discussing tens and ones, odd and even, bigger and smaller, and representing the numbers in different ways. Book Week has been fun, too: we enjoyed stories via Google Meets that the KS2 children had written just for us, read by the authors themselves, and shared favourite stories each day.

KS1: Have you ever seen elephants in custard? Have you ever heard a dinosaur roar? Key Stage One have! This week, as part of 'Book Week' we have been sharing and enjoying a range of brilliant books. Can your child tell you something about the beautiful book The Proudest Blue written by the Olympic medallist Ibtihaj Muhammad? Can they tell you about one of the dinosaurs from our performance poem Dinosaurs Galore? Or can they tell you why the Teddy Robber stole the teddies? We also enjoyed an online performance by the London Philharmonic Orchestra to the story of Elephants in Custard. In Art, we have been creating and experimenting with textured paint using flour, salt, glitter, pencil shavings and more!

LKS2: To celebrate Book Week, Yr 3/4 have been putting their DT skills to great use, making their own books in various shapes and sizes and then filling them with some great stories and creating information texts. We've also been learning some great tips from Jeremy Strong, Marcus Rashford, and the poet, Joseph Coelho. In Maths, the children have been continuing with fractions and money, a theme that they continued in the My Bnk activities. All the children have also been practicing their skipping and the top 10 will be selected at the end of this half term as part of a virtual challenge across the borough.

UKS2: The 5/6 children have donned their white coats and science goggles to plan and design their own experiments: finding out whether rusting is an irreversible change. They looked at different variables such as temperature, liquids, the amount of air and different materials. We have also been making books of our own version of The Tale of the Three Brothers and reading traditional tales from a variety of different cultures.
