Online safety is at the forefront of many parents' and carers' minds. Technology moves so quickly that it can be hard to keep up with the changes. Barnet Council has a Children and Young People Board and at its last meeting a young person requested that more information should be shared with parents and carers to raise awareness about online safety and mental health linked to it.

With 'Gaming Disorder' becoming an official health condition, we suggest setting reasonable time limits for gaming. Parents can use parental controls on devices to limit the time a child plays games. It is worth having a conversation with your child to discuss and agree how long you would like them to play the games for.

As your child becomes a teenager, it is likely the internet will be a part of their daily life. They will adapt quickly to new technology and use it to communicate, socialise and create. Most teenagers have access to the internet using a smartphone or tablet, and use a wide range of social networking sites as a vital part of their relationships with others.

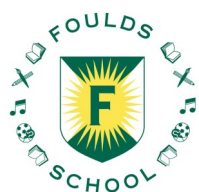

Borough Cricket Tournament

On Thursday 23rd May, after weeks of trials and training, Foulds sent two boys' teams (Foxes and Falcons) and a girls' team (Flamingos) to the Borough's annual cricket tournament. The boys were looking to reclaim the Borough title after success in 2017 whilst the girls were looking to become champions for the seventh year running.

Foulds Flamingos

'In the group stage, the girls had to compete amongst five different teams. Luckily for us, we had a lot of practice (thanks to Mr Morley) giving us a clear advantage over the opposition. We played four matches in the group stages, winning all of them comfortably - displaying accurate bowling, confident batting and solid fielding.

Finishing top of our group ensured our place in the semi-finals in which we played Dollis. We then beat them decisively to make it into the Borough final! Our final match was against Goldbeaters (a school we had played before and beaten) but sadly they upped their fielding and batting this time and we came (a very respectable) second place.'

Mr Morley's thoughts: The girls showed a fantastic attitude from day one of training and their camaraderie helped them sail through to the final. It was a disappointment for the team to fall at the final hurdle but this shouldn't detract from the girls' efforts and achievements.



Foulds Falcons

The tournament started off well with a crushing victory against Danegrove; with us getting 241 and with them only managing to get 198 (teams start on 200). Match two was tough as we lost to a very good team - named Akiva - with them getting 228 and us 222. Match three was pretty straightforward against Parkfield. As they batted first, a lot of easy wickets put us on the front foot going into the batting. Eventually we defeated them 266 to 213! Match 4 was against Goldbeaters. Looking to qualify for the semi-finals as the best runners-up, again we played our A-game and won 257 to 219 which proved enough to make the final four!

Going into the semi-final, we were up against Colindale - winners of Group 2 Foulds batted well against a good bowling team to set a score of 245 for them to chase. It went to the wire but they edged us out by 8 runs - a devastating defeat! However we bounced back in the 3rd/4th place play-off as we went head-to-head with Akiva again - this time running out deserved winners to seal the bronze medal.'

Mr Morley's thoughts: The team showed great resilience to bounce back from their loss against Akiva to qualify. Narrowly losing to eventual winners Colindale in the final, they then bounced back again to beat Akiva in the 3/4th place playoff. With 7/9 of the team Y5 - they will be back stronger next year.



Foulds Foxes

The Foulds Foxes were put into Group 3 with: Sacred Heart, Dollis, St Catherine's and Broadfields. The team was determined going into their first game, but unfortunately they weren't ready for Dollis, who were on point, and lost their first game by only 16 runs. In their next game Foulds were determined to beat Broadfields and did so - coming out with a comfortable victory to bring their hopes up.

Then we had a lunch break to discuss our tactics going into the next match against St Catherine's (one of the favourites for the competition). We decided to keep the fielding how it was before but changed our batting partners to be at our full potential for the challenge ahead. We went into the game ready and came out victorious.

Going into the last game, we knew our opponents (Sacred Heart) hadn't had a good start to the tournament and we were also aware that we needed points to make it through to the next stage; so we were ruthless. Sacred Heart batted first with a final score of 198 (each team started on 200) and we achieved a score of 278. Unfortunately, despite finishing 2nd in the group, the Foulds Foxes didn't qualify for the semi-finals. However we had fun and won 3 out of 4 of our matches which is a great achievement.'

Mr Morley's thoughts: Having narrowly lost their opening game (to eventual finalists Dollis), the team went from strength to strength, winning all their remaining games including a great win over St Catherine's. It says something about Foulds that we could field such a strong second team.
