Welcome back to the new half term.

We had the PTA AGM at the start of the week and I wanted to thank the PTA committee for all of their amazing work. The money that the PTA raise for the school is invaluable to our running. Foulds, like the majority of schools, runs off an in year deficit budget. This means we constantly have to try to make savings. With the school closed to many lettings both last term and currently, that has also had a huge impact. The money raised by all of you helps to ensure that the children do not lose out on any opportunities and we can deliver an inspiring curriculum. The PTA are also creating some exciting ideas to replace the Christmas Fair this year and with the success of our own clothes day before half term, we are going to have a few more of those. There are other potential ideas in the pipeline that I will let you know about as they come along.

Today brings with it new guidance for schools and as such all of our after school clubs that we had just got up and running (with the exception of LBB our After School Provision), will have to stop. We know this will be disappointing for the children.

This week across the school:

EYFS: This week, the children have learned a lot about November 5th and firework safety. They have impressed us with their knowledge of how to stay safe around fireworks, created huge collage bonfires and come up with some really interesting descriptive words about fireworks. In Phonics, the children have begun to learn letter shapes and the sounds that they make (they are doing brilliantly!) while in Maths we have looked closely at the number 5, how many ones make up different numbers and different ways to make totals.

KS1: We have kicked off this term by beginning our fantastic SPACE topic. In this topic, we have been exploring non-fiction texts and thinking about the features and layout of their information pages. Can your child remember 3 of the features of a non-fiction information page? In Science this week, each class took a nature walk on the school grounds to look for, and collect, signs of Autumn. We will be tracking the trees throughout the year to observe how they change. In Art, we have begun our toy collages using different materials and types of paper.

LKS2: In Yr3/4 we have had a great week back at school, ready for learning. We've all spent time 'remembering' and focusing on poppies and Remembrance Sunday. The children have had the chance to create their own poetry as well as become radio presenters searching for volunteers. Our new topics of 'Roman Britain' and 'Forces' have also begun - the children have had a good think about what they'd like to learn over the half term.

FOULDS SPORTS NEWS

Foulds' pre-season kicked off in earnest as 'Foulds Green' took on 'Foulds Blue' at the Byng Road playing fields. The game was the first time the boys had kitted up since March when the Central League season was suspended.

For the new recruits it was their first full game. It was also an opportunity to test pre-season fitness of the whole squad over 40 minutes.

In the early stages it was quite even in regards to possession and chances. Foulds Green though looked resolute in defence and some smart stops from the keeper ensured they kept it tight at the back. As the game progressed, Foulds Green then began to take charge. Foulds Blue didn't defend in such numbers and some clinical finishing from the Greens saw them build a lead. As the game progressed the pattern continued as Foulds Green's imperious defending and lethal finishing ensured they ran out comfortable winners.



Next up: The Central League 2020-21 season continues to be on hold with no games scheduled until at least January. That gives the squad time to continue to train and prepare.
