

LOST PROPERTY


Please check the cupboard outside the library (in the departure lounge) for any items your child has lost. Thank you.

Copthall Athletics



















On 25th June, Foulds' courageous Copthall team competed in the Copthall athletics tournament at Allianz Park. Foulds were competing in the medium schools category against 7 two-form entry schools.

Following trials involving all of the children in KS2 and training at QE Boys (and many lunchtimes and breaks!), Foulds were ready to compete. In a thrilling morning we competed in the field events: high jump, long jump, javelin, speed bounce and ball throw.



The first event to be held was Yr6 girls' high jump where our heroine ensured Foulds came out with an astonishing 2nd place finish. Meanwhile, at the other side of the arena, Yr5 were trying their hardest and ended up getting an epic 2 first places and 2 second places. With a great start to the morning for Foulds, it was the Yr6's turn for field events. In the boys' Yr6 high jump we scored another great 2nd place and we then continued our solid performances to secure another first place finish and 3 more second places. By lunch, we knew that we had done well in the field events but had to keep putting in 100% if we wanted a chance to win overall.

For the afternoon track events and tug of war we went in with a positive attitude. First came 'sprints' which we knew was going to be a tough challenge but we were happy to battle through and put all our effort and resilience in. We tried as hard as we could to meet the high standards set in the morning.

During all these events, tug of war was in progress. We knew that tug of war was going to be a tough challenge so we went in knowing we had nothing to lose - marshalled by the formidable Ms Lam. Our first match was always going to be difficult against one of the large schools and unfortunately we failed to clinch a result. Our next match was therefore a 'must win' if we wanted any chance to progress but unfortunately we didn't get it and ended up being eliminated.

Back to the track and it was the 300m (for Yr5s) and 500m (for Yr6s) and some of our running club stars produced some good results. Next it was the Yr4, 5 and 6 boys and girls relays. Some slick baton changes helped but at times the teams didn't quite have the raw pace of opposing teams.

After a parade around the track for all the schools, we reached the end of the competition and all sat in anticipation. To our amazement we won the field events trophy and finished a respectable 3rd (from 8) overall.

Well done to all the competitors, reserves, reporters, coaches, staff and parents who contributed towards Team Foulds 2019.


