This week has been another busy one, where the Foulds' values have shone through. The team work, self-belief and resilience seen across the school during sports day and inter-house football and netball was fantastic and it was lovely to see all of the children, no matter their age, challenging themselves. House lunches for the Juniors was new this week and, whilst the children found it tricky at first, by the second day, they were enjoying eating with different people and making new friends. Next year, once a half term, we will have house lunch and this will help the children bond with others in their houses and make friends across Key Stage 2.

I have had a number of requests for holiday absence for the last two days of term. As a school we follow the borough policy which says these are unauthorised absences and to fine parents for these holidays. To be clear, we do not see any of the money from these fines, they go to the borough. Our term dates have been on our website from September and have been published in our newsletter repeatedly. The children always really enjoy the last few days of term with their teacher and these are important days for their transition.

In May, I wrote my section of the newsletter to the Year 6, reminding them that the SATs are just one set of tests that they would sit in their lives and that they only show a certain aspect of their capabilities. On Tuesday we received the results of the SATs and whilst the children will receive their personal results today, I wanted to share their phenomenal success as a cohort with you all. The children's results blew us away. We could not be prouder of how they have done, but also of how their results truly reflect how hard they all worked, the self-belief and resilience that they showed and the excellent learning behaviour they showed. These, along with our Early Years and Key Stage 1 data, are now published on our website. We are incredibly pleased with all of the attainment and progress made this year by all of the children and we look forward to continuing to build on this next year.




