Football League

After dominating possession and the shot tally against St Andrews (which ended 0-0) and Monken Hadley (a frustrating 1-0 loss), Foulds' third league game was away to Manorside where the team was hoping for 3 points and goals!

The game got off to the perfect start as an assertive Foulds took the lead within the first two minutes. Although Foulds were on top, Manorside equalised against the run of play. A sublime chip from the Foulds' striker put Foulds 2-1 but again Manorside were allowed back into the game as they equalised with their second attempt on goal.

Going into half time, the team knew they were creating chances and with a tighter defence, the game could be won. Again the half got off to a perfect start as a rampaging run on the left saw the ball hit home from a tight angle. Foulds were in complete control and for the remainder of the first half, it was attack on defence as the crossbar was rattled and numerous chances went begging (chances that the team would rue). With two minutes left on the clock, a loss of focus allowed Manorside to break and equalise again with one of their few attempts on goal. Rattled by a third equaliser against the run of play, the team allowed a buoyant Manorside to snatch victory at the death and secure an improbable win.

At the end of the game, it was a hard one for the team to take. For the third game running, they dominated possession and had by far the most chances. However matches are settled by goals and unfortunately the fourth goal (that would have killed the game) never came and Manorside managed to come back from the brink.

Next up - it's derby day as Foulds take on Christchurch in the League on the 14th January. Then it's a home match to All Saints on January 23rd.

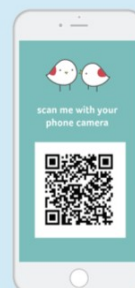
