Welcome back to a new year at Foulds!

Last week it was wonderful to welcome all of our families back to the school.

It has been lovely to watch the children come back in, smiling - thriving! We have had the whole school in the hall for assemblies for the first time in over 18 months and it has been wonderful to have everyone in the same room.

Induction Week has been around the theme of Growth Mindset and metacognition. We have been reading the book 'Maybe' by Kobi Yamada and each class has focussed on a number of different pages and thinking about the messages it is giving us. The book is all about individuality, Growth Mindset and potential. The book starts with a simple question: *Have you ever wondered why you are here? And ends with: One thing is for sure, you are here. And because you are here...anything is possible. The book is beautifully written and has inspired our displays around the school, pictures of which I will share with you in the coming weeks.*

In all classrooms we now have Characteristics of Learning trees. This continues our school journey around Growth Mindset and metacognition. The idea of the tree is to make some of the characteristics of learning that we think are key to children becoming successful learners more visible to them. Each child has a leaf and chooses a branch (a characteristic) to work on. They can spend as much time on a branch mastering it as they think they need. Once they have mastered a characteristic we want them to move their leaf to work on another whilst also practising the first one, so they can see if they have mastered and can apply it. The Characteristics of Learning breakdown will be up on the website shortly.

The children have also worked on a dream for the future road map where they have chosen a dream that they have for the future (near or far). They then thought about what actions they need to take to achieve their goal as well as any nemesis (roadblocks they may come across along the way) they may have to defeat in order to achieve it. The children then thought about the toolbox that they already have to help them reach their goal: their team (cheerleaders), their values (most important beliefs), their strengths and well being (what will help them to stay healthy and strong). We will do this twice a year and the children will keep these so that they can look back at them in years to come.

Finally, we do, of course, have to remain careful with regards to Covid. We have gone from a position of a lot of restrictions in place to far fewer. Barnet Public Health has updated their guidance. Following this, as a school, if a child is a household contact of a case of Covid-19 (ie lives in the same house as someone with it), they must have a PCR test and not come into school until they have a negative result. If we have cases in school, we will speak to any parent where we believe the child was a close contact (sat next to them in a lesson/at lunch over the last 48 hour period) and strongly suggest they take a PCR test but at the very least take a lateral flow test before coming into school. We will then send a general letter out to the class that the child is in, in the same way we would if there was chickenpox.

Parking Guidance



This year we are continuing our work towards improving the safety for children and the local residents during drop off and pick up times. It is a very busy time and we are aware of the challenges that children, parents, carers and residents face with the number of cars that come and go in a short space of time. The safety and health of our children is a key priority and we would like to thank all parents and carers who do drive and park safely.

We would like to ask all parents and carers to continue working with us this year to keep our children safe by following our Parking Guidance.

Foulds Safer Parking Guidance

- The safety of our children is our key priority
- Drive safely, with due care and attention, and in accordance with the Highway Code at all times
- Reduce driving speeds to a maximum of 20mph on the roads around the school
- Be continually aware of children who are walking, scooting or cycling in the local area when driving or parking a car
- Obey the parking restrictions around the school at all times and if needed be prepared to park further away and walk
- There should be no parking or stopping momentarily on the zig-zag lines outside the school gates to drop off or pick up passengers. The markings are there to provide a clear area in which Foulds children can cross more safely.
- Double yellow lines—unless you have a disabled parking permit, you are not permitted to park on double yellow lines at any time.
- Be considerate in choosing a place to park that does not impact on pedestrian safety or local residents
- Turn off your engine when safely stopped to reduce idling fumes
- Do not park in the school car park but park and walk your child in as this is a working car park.


