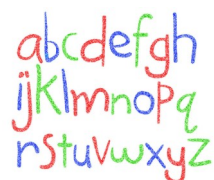
If you are going to an organised Display or having Fireworks at Home — Please remember the Firework Code

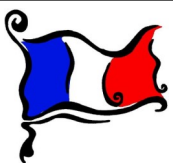

## Foulds School Cross Country



On 18th October 2018, Foulds School took part in the Barnet Borough Cross Country event held at Allianz Park. There were a mixture of year groups in KS2 participating in this event, taking on the Borough's best from 37 schools!

Mr Morley as well as Jo Kent helped prepare us for this event. We had the trials down at the Christ Church field. The top five then participated in another trial and children were then selected for the Foulds team to take part in the Cross Country event.

It was very intense standing on the starting line. However all the team showed the same determination and resilience shown in the trials. The parents and teachers were very supportive and we were very proud of ourselves.

Foulds had some high finishes with the children giving their all. One of our team finished an incredible 2nd to get a medal. When the results were tallied, Foulds finished in 10th place (out of 37 schools) - a big improvement on last year. With a lot of enthusiasm and talent emerging, we hope we can do even better at the second meet in February as we look to get back to number one (and perhaps a 10th Borough title)!

Thank you to the parents who volunteered to help transport the team to Allianz Park.

# Football vs Underhill

## Football: Foulds vs Underhill

Foulds pre-season continued with a double friendly against Underhill Juniors at OECC. Foulds' steep learning curve continued as they again took on more experienced opponents, looking to improve upon their performances against Christ Church. For all but two it was their second ever game and two more children made their debut (with 3 players jet-setting off for half term!) However all the Foulds players made great strides and showed signs of progress....

### **Foulds Foxes 4-3 Underhill B**

The Foxes started off settled but full of energy. They competed well all over the park to match their opponents who had plenty of pace. In a generally even first half, it was Underhill though who took their chances to go 2-0 up. After half time, Foulds deservedly pulled a goal back and confidence rose. Foulds started to show more cutting edge going forwards and soon equalised before scoring a third to go 3-2 up. Underhill scored to stay in the game but Foulds' fourth (and determination late on) ensured they ran out winners in front of the cheering parents.



### **Foulds Falcons 0-2 Underhill A**

Meanwhile the Falcons conceded in the first minute but didn't panic and soon steadied the ship to battle well against their opponents for the rest of the half with neither team finding the back of the net. Underhill attacked for much of the second half but Foulds showed defensive organisation and dogged determination to hold their opponents for long periods with the Y5 keeper making fine saves when called upon. Underhill eventually doubled their lead whilst Foulds hit the post on a counter-attack as the game ended 2-0 to the visitors.



Overall both teams showed clear signs of improvement in their second pre-season game. Defensively the teams were more organised and resilient. Confidence and attacking prowess going forwards improved but is still an area to work on as the rookie squad continues to develop and gel.



### **Next up:**

The League campaign begins as Foulds host All Saints at OECC on November 2nd. Those not involved in that game will take part in a Foulds development match.

A Foulds girls' team will debut in a friendly against Christ Church on 8th November. Then the Foulds 1st team will be 'up for the Cup' as we host Woodridge on Thursday 15th November in the Central Cup.
