As the term draws to a close and I reflect back, I am so proud of our children. The Foulds' community has shown such resilience every day. I know when we came back in September, we hoped all things Covid would be a thing of the past and the constant unknown would have faded away into a distant memory. Unfortunately, we have all recognised that is sadly not the case, but I thank all of our families for being careful and taking all the precautions that the school has asked for.

It has been a busy run up to Christmas with the children enjoying the Infant production of Prickly Hay, the pantomime, the Key Stage Two Christmas workshop day and much, much more. I spoke in assembly last week about how, at this time of year, as we become more and more tired, our growth mindset and levels of resilience begin to dip. We become more easily frustrated with each other and little things that would not normally bother us, now do. As a school, we always talk about the importance of having a growth mindset and of being resilient, so I think it is also important for us to recognise that this can sometimes be a struggle - that it isn't always going to be easy and that that is okay! In the wake of the last two years, this is an even more important message as the children are becoming tired more easily and still haven't built back their stamina for being in school.

We also want the children to realise that when they are in the red zone (Zones of Regulation: feeling angry/ terrified/elated/out of control) this happens to us all and that it is alright to be in that zone. We want them to understand that they need to not think about how they can get out of the zone initially but more how they look after themselves whilst in that zone. As adults, we all know that moving from any of the above emotions back to being calm and happy is not something that they can snap out of but more of a process. We want the children to understand what this process is for them, so that they can have it in their toolkit to help them when they find themselves in the red zone in the future.

The Christmas Fair was a huge success raising over £8000. Thank you to the Christmas Fair Committee for putting in so much time and effort to organise such a wonderful event, especially with Covid rates as they were, there was always the possibility it would have to be called off. Thank you to all of you for joining us - the support and amazing feeling of community that comes through from all of our families is always very much appreciated.




























### Yr 3/4 Recorder Concert


## Dick Bailey Cup vs St Vincent's
