## 3/4/19 Parent Coffee Morning

### Report format:

Parents noted that they could see the amount of effort the teachers put into the reports. They are well written and very useful pastoral guidance.

- Liked the individual feedback from children from previous years- reflects what they think about themselves.
- Possibly useful to have English and Maths comments in the specific part of the report.  
Would like more academic guidance - unclear what targets are (clarification that all objectives for the year group a child is working on are put in this section) and then can be very clear how to support at home.
- Question of what it means to be at Greater Depth. Greater depth means that the children have fulfilled the curriculum at the age related expectations and are now looking at those areas in greater depth.

### ***Actions:***

- *Review whether to include individual feedback from children next year.*
- *Continue to review report format to ensure it is accessible and useful.*
- *Send out the English and maths objectives in September and then again with reports.*
- *Meet the teacher - video/slides on website - text out link to parents. Include explanation of greater depth.*

### Clubs:

- Felt that there were plenty of clubs.
- Noted that the children are having great French lessons provided by the school, so may be possibly why children aren't taking up Talk like a Native.
- Noted that children are loving netball club.
- Running club - falls in numbers in winter time due to weather and mud. Can be competitive.
- Concern about 3/4 football club and whether if children do not get in this year there is no chance further up the school. Noted by school that there are limited numbers as it is run by one staff member only.
- After school club - real value for money, noted could see how great it was when cake sales were in the dining hall. Parents were unclear that you could book on an ad hoc basis. School noted numbers very low but was also noted that some parents may have been waiting for the new term so as could change arrangements.

### ***Actions:***

- *Include list of clubs twice a half term in newsletter.*
- *Running club - school to speak to running club about making sure there is a slower runner at the back so that all children can be involved.*
- *School to see what other language clubs are used by other local schools.*
- *School to speak to other local schools about how they run their football teams.*
- *3/4 trials for football to be text out to parents so that all children have kit in school (noted that kit should be in school for the half term and not be taken home).*
- *School to speak to Non Stop Action to ask them to arrange matches with other local schools and about quality.*
- *School to speak to After School Club about advertising more. Text out to parents about it being an ad hoc service too.*

### Fundraising:

- School explained new initiatives - parent pay (able to donate however much would prefer), amazon wish list (for each class on new website)
- There is a certain fatigue over relentless fundraising - it would be good for children to be more aware of charities that we are supporting and their purpose. Would be good to support a local charity eg Noah's Ark. Possibility of a vote.
- Lots of own clothes days, can we give option of wear a theme/no theme or own clothes/pyjamas?

### ***Actions:***

- *Parents suggested Reception texts/any texts requesting anything are sent whole school and put in newsletter.*
- *School to review fundraising and charities we fundraise for.*
- *School to think about themes for dress up days.*

### Ofsted:

- Parents felt they were pleased with the Ofsted report and that it was positive.
- Parents felt that they could see changes already from September.
- Parent survey out at the moment NOT the same as the one that went out in January from Ofsted - more on it.
- 

### ***Actions:***

- *School to keep reminding parents to fill out survey and explain it isn't the same as the Ofsted one.*

### AOB:

- E-safety workshop for parents:
  - parents to be told in advance what it will cover, how it will help. School will try to arrange during an event eg slumber party evening/make later in the evening so more parents can attend.
  - Parents said they wouldn't mind a charge.
  - Parents felt a sign up sheet would ensure people committed to the workshop.
  - school to look combining certain parent workshops with Christ Church.
- Parent survey - no 'don't know' so that you have to commit to an answer - a parent agreed that this was normal for surveys and important to do this way.
- Some ideas discussed to be passed on to PTA (not relevant to be noted here).



## Quad Kids



Foulds entered the Borough's Quad Kids event at Allianz Park. Following trials and training in Y5/6 PE, 4 boys and 4 girls were selected to form the Foulds team to take on 16 other teams from across Barnet.

Quad Kids tests an athlete's all round ability, having to be able to sprint (75m), run

medium distance (600m), throw (vortex howler) and jump (standing long jump). The team's scores are combined to find the team's overall score.

All the children showed great team spirit and athletic ability to rack up big points for the team. At the end of the event, the scores were added and Foulds finished 3rd to secure the bronze medals (to add to the gold and bronze medals gained at the Sportshall North and Borough Sportshall competitions respectively).

Well done to all the children who competed. Mrs McElarney said of the team 'I'm super proud of them - a fantastic bunch of kids. So well behaved and well deserved!!! Did exactly what was asked of them. Go Foulds!!!'
