QEBs Yr5 Challenge



The waiting room was a big (not very big) room with several pictures on the wall. A few minutes later, the Yr7s came in. They each chose a school to work with and then an adult came and led us into the great hall

We sat ourselves down at a table with our Yr7 helper and someone from the staff introduced us to the 2019 Yr5 challenge and we soon started our challenge.

The first round was the limerick round. A limerick is a poem that consists of five lines and is usually funny (there are many more rules). One person from each group went up to the stage to read out the poem that their group made.

Next it was the maths round. The team was split into two groups; one team did questions 1 and 3, while the other 2 and 4

the questions were easy but then it got a lot harder. After the first four rounds, one person from each group had to go up to the stage and spell the words the adult had given them. We chose a brave soul from the group to go up for us. Everyone except us was eliminated and we won the spelling round! Hooray!

Then we did the crossnumber round. We solved sums and wrote down the answers on the boxes - one box per digit. One pair did half of the squares and the other pair did the other half.

When the results were announced, we got the 'best spellers' award and Mrs Simon took a photo of us holding up our certificates. We really enjoyed the Yr5 challenge.


