
Cake Sale TOMORROW

Yr 4 Powerleague Tournament

Last week Foulds entered two teams into the Y4 powerleague tournament (the only school in the area to do so) and both teams distinguished themselves.

Foulds Falcons

The Foulds Falcons won the Y3 Borough tournament and played well as the B team at the Y4 Powerleague tournament last season. This year they returned after a fantastic year of training and a great 7-4 win away vs Orion on Orion's astroturf in a recent warm up match.

From the start they played with their trademark style and teamwork. In the two warm-up friendly games they made quick work of Sacred Heart. When Whittings Hill equalised in game 2, they calmly pressed and ran out 3-1 winners. In the group games, they continued to pass well and attack fluently. They defeated Moss Hall, Sacred Heart and Whittings Hill with ease to cruise through to the knockout stages. In the semi-finals they met Underhill. Within minutes they took the lead and the goals kept flowing to record an emphatic win.

In the final it was Cromer Road. Foulds went 1-0 up but Cromer Road hit back. Two more Foulds' goals had Foulds in charge but Cromer pulled one back to make it 3-2 and set up a tense couple of minutes. However the Foulds Falcons, never ones to falter, continued to play with passion and style and ran out winners to secure a 3-2 win and secure the Barnet Central title!

The Foulds Falcons saw the entire squad make their competitive debut. With the warmup event at Byng Road cancelled due to a waterlogged pitch, the team only had a couple of playground sessions to prepare. However the team made up in effort what they may have lacked in experience.

In their first game they put on a great team performance to run out 2-0 winners over Woodridge. Game two proved tougher against Underhill as their opponents took victory. The group games began with a rematch against Woodridge. Again the team showed good defensive prowess to keep their opponents at bay and had enough firepower to record another 2-0 win. Games against Underhill and Cromer Road proved tougher encounters but the team showed improved performances and went down fighting. Well done!!


Re: Saracens Cheer Classes at Foulds School.
