Welcome back! The children have come back rested (bar being tired from trick or treating!) and ready to go with their learning. Walking around the school, going from room to room, whatever age, you can see (and hear) the buzz of activity, with the children really enjoying their work and actively learning.

I always find that our hall provides a great window into the learning going on in school. You walk through and there is a PE lesson with children showing off their balancing skills; then you are transported back to the early 1940's with children being evacuated to different families; then a class practising their assembly about the Anglo Saxons; then a science lesson on different forces with paper aeroplanes flying past your head and items being dropped from on high - all being carefully measured and recorded; then jive music blares as children learn a new dance; then a sobbing Romeo is leaning over Juliet as the Young Shakespeare Company bring a Shakespearean classic alive for our Year 5 and 6 children...and that is just during school hours! There is such a wonderful hub-bub of activities going on that you cannot help but smile as you go past!

The week of the 15th November is Anti-Bullying Week. The theme of the week is 'One Kind Word' and the children will be thinking about how kindness can be spread through acts of kindness that can be passed on from one person to another. One way we are going to show the children this is through something called the blue ribbon activity. Every child will start with three blue ribbons. The first ribbon is for themselves - when they are kind to themself - a skill we think is incredibly important for children to learn to support their own mental health. They will do some work around this so they understand what being kind to yourself means and might look like and when they have been kind to themself during that week they can tie the blue ribbon around their own wrist. The children then think of someone in the school that they value (maybe someone who has done something for them that made a significant difference; someone who helped them in a small way; someone who has inspired them). We encourage them to think outside of just their friendship circle and again we do a lot of work around this in the classroom. They then give that person two blue ribbons and tell the person why they felt that they should have their ribbon. One ribbon is to tie around their wrist and the next is for that child to then pass on to someone else! The plan is to then watch the ribbons spread and we would ask for that week for the children to come back into school wearing their ribbons each day. If children have two ribbons on their wrist and they are given more, they will pass those ones on and therefore be able to spread the kindness further and further! Please do ask your child why they have their ribbon.

With Guy Fawkes night coming up and lots of fireworks displays back on for the first time in a few years, please talk to your children about keeping safe and enjoying the displays from a safe distance.


FOULDS SPORTS NEWS Foulds vs Northside
