Governing Body Visit

The Foulds Governing Body was delighted to be invited into school recently to observe a morning in the life of Years 5 and 6. It is abundantly clear how hard the staff and students have been working in the post-SATs world, with an exciting and challenging range of lessons, engaging external speakers, fun activities developing the school's values, and preparation for the all-important School Leavers' Production.

In just one action-packed morning governors were able to watch a variety of different types of learning. On arrival the Year 6 students were engrossed in an NSPCC presentation on keeping safe while Year 5 were tackling their maths lessons on shape and space. It was illuminating to see how adept the children were in applying a range of mathematical strategies to solve problems. Even more encouraging was the children's resilience in completing and evaluating their work. It is clear the school's focus on growth mindset is bearing fruit.

After break, governors watched a lesson where Year 6 children were discussing their 'superpowers' – the skills and capabilities they exhibit that make them proud to be who they are. It was fascinating to talk to the children about how they positively contribute to making Foulds such an exciting and vibrant learning environment. The visit finished with the opportunity to look at some of the fabulous book and display work that has taken place in recent weeks. The study of The Three Brothers and the visit to the Harry Potter studios have clearly enthused the children in their writing and art work. It was a privilege to read and enjoy the creative, inspired and sometimes hilarious writing being produced by all children in Years 5 and 6 that is constantly and consistently being reviewed, redrafted and enhanced.

The governing body would like to thank the children and staff at the school for hosting us so warmly and the visit was a wonderful validation of the strategies and initiatives we have been scrutinising and challenging this year. We await next year's governor visits with great excitement and enthusiasm.
