Scheduling payments over the year so we know what is coming up

We will be putting prices in the newsletter on the list of events.

Summer term was very expensive and some parents weren't keen on buying yoyos after the Growth mindset workshop. This is unfortunately how the workshop was funded and it was a great workshop that lots of the children talked about for a long time afterwards.

Poetry Competition - parents felt that all of the children's work had been published - this was not the case. A large number were but not all. Our writing curriculum is about writing for a purpose so we do enter competitions. If parents do not want to buy a published book at the end of it, they are entitled not to.

Can children work more in the year groups rather than in their split year classes

45 children in each cohort so it makes it very tricky to split them that way due to staffing. The majority of children are split in maths lessons in Key Stage 2 into year groups. Foulds is a one and a half form entry school and we are very clear from the point of parent tours, how the year groups work.

Class sizes - are we going over numbers?

There has been a few new children this year due to some mobility.

Sometimes we are given children by the borough that take us over numbers. We have no control over this. The child will have been given a place as they did not have a place in a school.

Homework - how much of our homework is statutory and how much is from school?

Homework - designed to consolidate class learning rather than new learning

Marking of homework - we want our class teachers to mark in depth the in-class work. Homework needs to be acknowledged only.

The old Ofsted framework set out that homework was statutory.

It becomes increasingly mandatory throughout school - Yr 4 - Yr 6 it is essential.

If you feel it is too easy, please see the class teacher in the first instance. NB if the class teacher feels that the child has not shown they can do the work in class, they will make this clear to you and will continue to give them the work until this is no longer the case.

NB The maths curriculum is adding and subtracting within 1-20 in Yr 1 (even if you feel that your children know these numbers and can work within them really well, the curriculum in Yr 1 does not go over these numbers, but goes into greater depth work within these numbers).

Times tables and reading are key for us. Timestables Rockstars is a great game.

Newsletter will be coming out online this term, but could reminders also go on homework slips?

We do not want to add more work load for our teachers. If the information is appropriate for a specific phase it will go on the homework slips. If it appears in the newsletter, this does not have to be repeated elsewhere. Could we have texts go to both parents? Unfortunately this is really expensive and is a year on year cost. We would ask one parent to forward it to the other if they feel it is necessary.

Can we tell parents to not use the Teachers 2 Parents app as this doesn't work? - Sent out in last week's newsletter.

Reception Baseline

We are not doing it this year. Next year it will be mandatory.

Yr 5/6 Trip to RAF Museum

We got off the coach and walked into a building called "H7". H7 was full of World War II planes and it also included army helicopters and a Typhoon. After that, we went to a classroom building to do a coding activity and even built our own compasses using code. We learnt about the skills that RAF pilots need and did some reflex training to see who would be fit to fly! After that we had lunch and explored the rest of H7.

In the afternoon we went to H4 which had a lot of bombers such as Lancasters, Vulcan Bombers and Black Hawks. We explored some of the navy boats; some of which you could go inside!

After we explored H4, we went to the home building where there was a giant seaplane in the centre of the area. There was an entrance into the plane so we could go inside. You could see the captain's seat, the giant engine and the tiny toilet!

After a game of family-it on the lawn, we went to H2 where we saw the World War I planes. We found out that most of the planes were made of fabric and cardboard!


If your child is sick or will not be in school for any particular reason please could you telephone the office on 020 8449 2714 as soon as possible in the morning to let us know.
