Learning to feel calmer and having strategies to share and deal with worries when they come along is a vital life skill for us all. We do a huge amount of work with all children at school on this and they develop a wide range of strategies and vocabulary to manage emotions and talk about what they are thinking and feeling as they move through our PSHE curriculum which is great.

Supporting your child's mental health, encouraging resilience, emotional literacy and just having time with them to share what's important to them **right now** is crucial. A really great resource for this is the Calm Zone on Childline's website. You will find videos, games, breathing exercises, crafting activities and yoga all aimed at children.

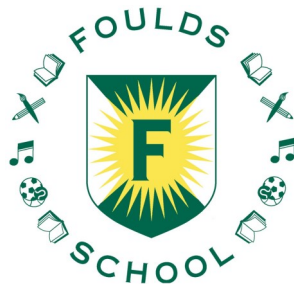
