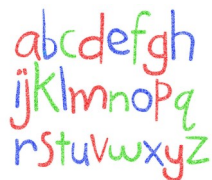
If you are going to an organised Display or having Fireworks at Home — Please remember the Firework Code

Phonics Evening



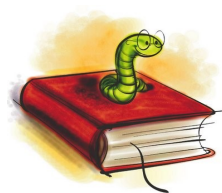
On Thursday 7th November, parents of Reception children (and any other interested parents!) are invited to attend an evening session where we will share how we teach reading and writing in Reception.
