Even though the weather is getting colder outside and there was talk of Blue Monday this week, the children have had another great week. Throughout the school, there is always lots going on and it is fantastic to walk around and see how positive the children are towards their learning. It has been over a year now where we have been working on resilience and growth mindset with the children (the belief that our brains are a muscle and, like every other muscle in our body, when we exercise it, our brain can grow. We exercise our brain by challenging ourselves in our daily life, not giving up when we find something difficult, but persevering.

Sometimes when something new like this is introduced, it can become a word or phrase that is talked about with very little meaning attached to it. This could not have been more opposite at Foulds. All of the staff have really worked hard to embed this work so that it really has become a norm within the school. You can really see the impact of this work in the children's everyday behaviour for learning and their progress. Children throughout the year groups, stick to something, not giving up at the first hurdle. They are choosing trickier challenges for themselves than they might have in the past and relishing working on something tougher! This work has also married up with our values very well; our children are able to show their use of the Foulds values (resilience, respect, teamwork, self-belief, kindness and responsibility) in much of what they do, whether in the classrooms, in the playground or representing the school in some way.





FOULDS SPORTS NEWS Yr 6 Powerles aug

Foulds entered two teams into the annual Yr6 Powerleague tournament.

The Foulds Falcons met Manorside in their first game but lost narrowly 1-0. Next they took on St Catherine's and played some great football. Despite having the upper hand, they couldn't find a goal and it ended 0-0. Next the team won 5-0 against Alma B before losing 3-1 to Moss Hall. Unfortunately the team didn't make the knockout stages so rounded things off with a close friendly vs Alma.

The Foulds Falcons saw six children making their debuts but were led admirably by two more experienced players. The rookie team found things hard going in the group - taking on Underhill, Cromer Road and All Saints' A teams. However with each game they got better in both their shape and resolve. At the end of the tournament, they took on their counterparts at Alma and won 6-3 in a great team performance. The rookie team will now get to play Alma in a full match today at OECC where a couple more children in Yr6 will make their competitive debuts.

Foulds B vs St Catherines B (Friendly)

Foulds B braved the conditions to play a full match in what would be an enthralling contest!

St Catherines adapted to the conditions far better and raced into a 3-0 lead as Foulds were sluggish and did not mark adequately. After a defensive shift, the team played better, holding their opponents but were undone by a 4th close to half time when they backed off and allowed a shot.

Discussions were had during the break and Foulds raced out of the blocks with confidence and spirit - taking the game to their opponent! Foulds, a team transformed, pulled four goals back to make it 4-4. With a minute to go, St Catherines scored to make it 5-4 but the team responded valiantly to make it 5-5 when the final whistle blew.

As it was such an epic game - we are looking to have a rematch at St Catherines soon.

Foulds vs Christ Church (Friendly)

Upon close inspection of the pitch, it was decided not to play the League game as scheduled. Instead the teams made the best of the situation and played out a (shorter) sparring match instead.

Foulds started the brighter - playing with confidence and attacking incisively. The team raced into a 2-0 lead before Christ Church pulled one back to make it 2-1 to Foulds at the final whistle. This sets up an intriguing contest for when the teams play in the league game - rearranged for Tuesday 11th February.
