Football (pre-season): Foulds vs Broadfields

With the friendly vs Christ Church postponed (rearranged for 8th October), Foulds' first full game of the season came against Broadfields from the Barnet West League.

The last time these two schools met was three seasons ago when Foulds lost on penalties after a tightly contested 2-2 draw in the Dick Bailey Cup. With Broadfields drawn to play the winner of Foulds vs Monkfrith this season – this pre-season encounter allowed both teams a potential sneak preview of each other.

For this opener at the Byng Road playing fields, nine of the twelve strong Foulds squad made their first team debut with the other three returning from last season's team.

From the off, the game was quite a physical and even contest with defences largely on top. Both sides had a couple of half chances to take the lead until a Broadfields player produced some magic to skip through three defenders to find room to fire home an opener. Foulds restarted the game and had an opportunity to equalise but the rushed shot sailed over.

In the second half rain lashed down in changeable conditions. The Foulds defence again generally held well and there was slightly better linkup going forward as Foulds forced the keeper into a couple of fine saves to deny the equaliser. As time ticked away, Foulds pushed forward but were hit with a second with the last kick of the game and it finished 2-0 to the visitors.

Overall a decent performance against a solid side. There was plenty of effort and the team organised well. The team will however need to improve their attacking play in the final third and find more ways to goals. They'll have this opportunity as the team debuts at OECC for the visit of Dwight School on 1st October as pre-season continues.
